His presence at the World Health Organisation has also helped to maintain recognition of the spa medicine as a key player in the treatment of a number of chronic illnesses and in prevention.

His death leaves the spa industry in a great void; it will be very difficult to replace him.

ESPA sends its sad condolences to Umberto Solimene's family, and in particular to his wife, as well as to the members of FEMTEC, and assures them of its support in overcoming this painful ordeal.
